Roll of Victory Show Procedures

Judge Selection

Judge submissions have to come from the Approved ROV Judges list that is compiled by the Activities Committee during the September board meeting. The Approved ROV Judges list is sent out to each show representative following the board meeting. Recognized point shows may submit five judges' names (in order of preference) to the Events and Junior Activities Department for the Activities Committee by February 1 (the year preceding their show) to be approved by the board of directors. If the recognized point show does not wish to submit names the American Angus Association will make the selections. Judges **MUST NOT** be contacted before they are approved.

During the February Board Meeting, the Activities Committee then considers the order of the show's preferred judges before making the final decision on top three judges for each of the 17 ROV shows. The Activities Committee has the discretion to add or remove judges from the submitted list.

One person cannot judge more than one ROV Show in the same show year. A person cannot judge an ROV show and the NJAS owned and bred-and-owned show within the same show year.

An email with the Activities Committee's final list of judges, listed in order of preference, is then sent to the show representative. Judges need to be contacted in the order of the letter. We ask that you contact the Events and Junior Activities Department once the judge has been confirmed. With the American Angus Association only allowing one person to judge an ROV show per show season, this helps ensure no overlap should the second or third choice have to be contacted.

The Activities Committee selects an additional five names to be used in the case of emergency. If this list is necessary, the Events and Junior Activities Department needs to be notified.

Photo Backdrops

The judge needs to be in the backdrop photos of the Grand and Reserve Champions for the Cow/Calf Pairs, Females and Bulls as the Association utilizes the backdrop pictures for public show reports.

Classifications

For any Angus show that receives premiums from the American Angus Association, the show must follow the American Angus Association Show Classifications to receive funds. Any classes listed in the classifications, which exceeds 15 head per class, should be broken into smaller classes. Furthermore, the recommended number of head per class varies per show based on number of head checked in. See recommendations below:

- Shows with less than 100 head: 8 head or less per class
- Shows with 100 – 200 head: 12 head or less per class
- Shows with more than 200 head: 15 head or less per class.

Any division that exceeds thirty (30) head is to be divided between early and late divisions with each split in division to receive full ROV points. Class breaks will be at the discretion of the American Angus Association staff or regional manager.

Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor Awards

Premier Breeder and Exhibitor calculations are to be standard at every Roll of Victory Show.

Awards and Premiums

The American Angus Association provides banners for both Female and Bull Division Winners as well as Grand and Reserve Champion Banners for Cow/Calf Pairs, Females and Bulls.

Recognized ROV shows will receive the following premium participation:

50-75 head	\$250 lump sum
76-99 head	\$750 lump sum
100 or more head	\$1500 lump sum

Premiums are to be used towards premiums paid to exhibitors.

Submitting Show Reports

When submitting show reports to receive premium support, the show report will need to have the following:

- Show date and location
- Registration numbers for all animals in program
- Results of the show; including placings, divisions, and champions
- Name, phone number and address of contact to send the premium check to

Probation

Any show that does not meet the required 70 animals shown will be put on probation for one year. The show will have one year to increase the numbers shown. If less than 70 head are shown for two consecutive years, the Activities Committee can choose to revoke the ROV status.

If a Super ROV Show has less than 100 Head shown, it will be placed on probation, meaning it will have one year to increase number of head shown back to 100 or more; if it shows less than 100 for two consecutive years, it will lose Super ROV Status. The Events and Junior Activities Department will notify each show as soon as it has been put on probation.

ROV Status

Any show that does not comply with the ROV Show Procedures will either be placed on probation or have their ROV status revoked by the Activities Committee.
